## The GNU Project's goals

- Create a completely free operating system
- Promote the ideals of free software

So what is the situation today?

### The good

- Free software exists for virtually every purpose, including computationally heavy tasks.
- Unjust treatment of users coming from proprietary software continues to push people towards free software.
- Libre social networks exist and are rapidly growing (Fediverse).
- Objectively great quality of software with the support of a community full of passionate people.

#### The bad

- Bleeding edge technology usually comes from/to proprietary software first.
- Modern, 100% freedom-respecting hardware is nonexistent.
- No regulatory ban in sight for software patents, DRM, etc.
- Free software still misunderstood and unknown to the general public.

#### Limits of high-level programming

- High-level programming should continue to be the core activity of the GNU Project.
- However, high-level programming alone will not lead to the goal of a free technological society.

# We are nowhere near making free software the <u>default</u>: where the user only uses free software in their everyday life

#### What is default today

- Automatically restrictive copyright terms
- Devices full of proprietary software
- Proprietary social networks

#### There are two approaches

- Try to convince people to switch to free software
- Make free software the default

#### Various levels of default

- Install a free operating system for grandparents
- Achieve industry-standard status for free software applications
- Require software funded by the public to be free (FSFE's Public Money, Public Code!)
- Ban proprietary software

#### What the default does

- Imposes the ideology of the people in power who determine the default
- Does not guarantee that the user understands the ideology behind the default

# The difference is that free software by default empowers users to be <u>active</u>

## Current status of the free software community

- Intentional community: still seen as an <u>alternative</u> lifestyle, not the default (default ≠ intentional)
- (Temporary) Autonomous Zone: a space which eludes established structures of control
- Still <u>depending on</u> structures that are antithetical to free software (e.g., processor chip oligopoly)
